

# March Updates

## Wear Green

Students will be permitted to wear green on Wednesday, March 17 to help celebrate St. Patrick's Day.

## Outdoor Clothing

Given that students have designated play areas at recess due to the homeroom bubbles, we are requiring students to bring snow pants to school every day. Students who are scheduled to have their outdoor time in the field, in the park or on the snow hills will be required to wear their snow pants. In a typical year, we would allow students with no snow pants to remain on the clear asphalt, but because of the Covid restrictions, we will insist that students play in their designated areas in order to ensure that the class bubbles are not mixing. Please ensure that your child has his/her snow pants and boots every day. We would also recommend that you send in extra mittens, socks and even a pair of pants because as the snow melts, the children tend to get wet throughout their three outdoor periods daily. **We cannot keep children in or make exceptions for those who do not have their snow pants. Your support and collaboration is needed to ensure your children are properly equipped.**

## School Dress Code

Please note that we have seen an increase of students not respecting the school dress code. Please refer to page 6 of the student Code of Conduct (Click [HERE](#)). No logos or patterned shirts are permitted. Further, hoodies and sweaters worn in class must be plain navy blue, plain gray or plain white. No other colour are permitted unless they were purchased in the past from our previous supplier and bear the school logo. For example, the gray Champion and white FILA sweaters recently sold at Costco are not permitted to be worn in class. Students violating the dress code will be asked to change or remove the sweater. **As parents, you must ensure your children's attire respects our dress code when leaving the house in the morning.**

Requested items: Crackers, granola bars, lunch snacks toothpaste
<b>Tuesday, March 23</b>
<b>Kindergarten and Grade 4</b>
Requested items: Pasta, rice, canned meats (tuna, salmon, chicken, ham) toothbrushes
<b>Wednesday, March 24</b>
<b>Grade 1 and Grade 5</b>
Requested items: Cookies, cake mix, muffin mix Shampoo/conditioner
<b>Thursday, March 25</b>
<b>Grade 2 and Grade 6</b>
Requested items: Canned fruit, canned veggies, canned sauces, apple sauce, pudding, Jell-O soap/body wash

Students are permitted to dress-down on the same day that they are bringing in their donation.
